This young boy's bunk room on Cape Cod is one of my favorite children's rooms ever. With its bold color palette, it packs an unexpected punch in a home distinguished by paler tones designed to reflect the Cape's landscape. Playing to the island surroundings here, too, the white and navy horizontally-striped drapery fabric evokes the image of a lighthouse with its traditional decorative spiral painting. Likewise, the pillow on the bed with its red cross on a white background is reminiscent of the design of a nautical flag. In addition to complementing its surroundings, the room manages to be functional, as well: the bunk beds and open seating area provide for plenty of space to play, and the fabrics and furniture are kid-friendly and durable. As with any child's room, I saw this space as an opportunity for us to be a little more playful and lighthearted.
